A privacy notice is a public document from an organization that explains how that organization processes personal data and how it applies data protection principles. Articles 12, 13, and 14 of the GDPR provide detailed instructions on how to create a privacy notice, placing an emphasis on making them easy to understand and accessible. If you are collecting data directly from someone, you have to provide them with your privacy notice at the moment you do so.

- Personal information:
 - o Name
 - O Affiliation (University) (the ERASMUS students are giving their home university)
 - Email address
 - o Paper Title

 The organizing committee your pre-entered data (given section 1.) will storing until issuing conference proceedings.

NOTICE: the proceeding is public, where is your name/ Title of conference paper/your affiliation. ONLY THE SELECTED PAPERS WILL BE PUBLISHED IN CONFERENCE PROCEEDING. The conference proceeding is provided by the international **ISBN** number and through the conference WEBsite will be accessible worldwide.

5. What are your data protection rights?

• the right to *access* – the conference <u>WEBsite</u> is public

- the right to *rectification* request to correct the inaccurate data
- the right to erasure delete your paper, with all data from the WEBsite of conference
- the right to *use* the conference WEBsite as *the reference* of your paper you can use the conference proceeding (if your paper will be published in conference proceeding) for proof of your publications. (On individual request the conference proceeding may be **printed**, but this is not free of charges)
